

#### SYMPOSIUM OVERVIEW

Stroke is the fourth leading cause of death in the United States and still the number one cause of adult disabilities. The South Texas population is close to 90% Hispanic, six times the national average; the percent of people with diabetes and hypertension in the area are significantly above national average. These statistics place our population at risk for stroke and it is important to address their increased risk as well as treatment options.

This two-day conference provides a forum in which to present current advances on the standard of care of acute stroke intervention including state of the art endovascular treatment, ischemic stroke prevention, subarachnoid hemorrhage and intracranial bleed acute management and in-hospital treatment, impact of nursing care on patient outcomes and aspects of stroke rehabilitation and recovery.

Advances in the diagnosis and treatment of stroke continue to evolve on an almost daily basis and continued education of primary providers is an absolute priority to improve patient care in South Texas.

#### TARGET AUDIENCE

This symposium is geared for physicians, mid-level practitioners, therapists, nurses, EMS personnel, students and other allied healthcare professionals that share our passion for improving stroke care in the Valley.

### **OBJECTIVES**

The objectives for the symposium include the following:

- 1. Describe EMS stroke recognition, pre-hospital care, and transport process.
- 2. Discuss current Mobile CT systems and understand the improvement in IV TPA usage.

- 6. Describe stroke causes in women.
- 7. Describe the differences in Border Hispanics and non-border Hispanics in acute ishemic stroke treatment and subarachnoid hemorrhage.
- 8. Identify recent advances in the treatment of acute ischemic stroke and understand the latest trials showing superiority of endovascular treatment.
- 9. Understand the core measures for the first 48 hours of acute stroke care.
- 10. Describe stroke causes in the pediatric population.
- 11. Understand the "Drip and Ship" paradigm in the current hub and spoke model for transferring appropriate large vessel strokes.
- 12. Outline the benefit and risk for surgical and endovascular interventions for intracranial aneurysms with subarachnoid hemorrage.
- 13. Review the latest advances in the treatment of cerebral aneurysms and discuss the utilization of new technologies in endovascular therapy including flow diverting stents.
- 14. Describe indications and expected outcomes of vasospasm treatment.
- 15. Discuss the latest trends in treating carotid artery disease as it relates to stroke risk.
- 16. Explain the advances in neurocritical care management for acute stroke patients.
- 17. Explain the advances in clot aspiration for intracerebral hemorrhage and intraventricular hemorrhage treatment.
- 18. Describe current research and developments on the management of acute intracerebral hemorrhage.
- 19. Understand all of the proven secondary stroke prevention treatments currently available.
- 20. Discuss the process of maintaining a primary stroke center and working towards a comprehensive status.
- 21. Understand obstructive sleep apnea's risk for stroke.
- 22. Discuss rehabilitation and recovery from stroke including the long term management of the stroke patient.
